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What is self harm?

• Cutting, burning, pinching, punching, picking, hair pulling, asphyxiation, substance use, starvation/harmful eating, risk taking behaviors (sexual interactions, extreme sports/activities)

Suicide facts:

- Suicide is 2nd leading cause of death in ages 10-24
- Suicide deaths in youth (ages 14-18) have increased 60% in the last decade (data from the CDC)

Items commonly used for cutting:

- Eyebrow razors
- Erasers (erase skin until it bleeds)
- Broken razors
- Matches (burning)
- Sharp objects knives, scissors, flossers
